Haverhill-based REACH Community Projects has achieved record-breaking financial gains for its clients as it continues to help people in hardship.

The record-high figure of £502,975 covers the period between October 2023 and March.

The amount is made up of emergency aid, utility support, benefits entitlements—including Child Benefit—debt relief and money from the Household Support Fund, which is due to end in

REACH supports those in financial crisis, in the Haverhill and surrounding areas, often starting with emergency aid from various funds to deal with the immediate situation and then tworking through a programme of debt relief and to claim benefit entitlements which, often through the complexities of the system, have
